ADRIANA DIAZ: Officials release new video of a deadly shooting at an ICE facility in Dallas.

ACTING U.S. ATTORNEY FOR THE NORTHERN DISTRICT OF TEXAS NANCY LARSON: It's clear from these notes that he was targeting ICE agents and ICE personnel.

[ON-SCREEN HEADLINE: Surveillance Video Shows Shooting at ICE Facility]

DIAZ: Investigators say they have no doubt the man who killed a detainee at an immigration facility in Dallas was targeting ICE officials. CBS News has obtained surveillance video from the field office showing agents helping shackle detainees get to safety. One detainee was killed and two others injured. No ICE officials were hit. Officials say the gunman had planned the attack for months. Omar Villafranca has more from the scene.

OMAR VILLAFRANCA: Surveillance video obtained by CBS News show the moment a gunman opened fire at detainees and agents inside a van parked outside a Dallas ICE facility. Shackled detainees are seen running for safety with agents ushering the men into the hall. ICE and ATF officials head back towards the van, pulling other victims away.

LARSON: What he did is the very definition of terrorism.

VILLAFRANCA: The FBI says the gunman, 29-year-old Joshua Jahn, was targeting ICE agents. Law enforcement believe he used a ladder to get on a rooftop near the ICE field office early Wednesday and then started shooting killing one detainee and critically injuring two others. Jahn was found dead by a self-inflicted gunshot wound.

FBI SPECIAL AGENT IN CHARGE JOE ROTHROCK: We now know that Jahn engaged in significant, high-degree of pre-attack planning. He searched for information about the office building and how to track ICE agents' locations.

VILLAFRANCA: The FBI says Jahn acted alone and used an eight-millimeter bolt action rifle which he legally purchased in August. Officials say they found notes that Jahn wrote detailing his plan and railing against ICE agents and the government.

LARSON: He wrote that he intended to maximize lethality against ICE personnel.

VILLAFRANCA: FBI Director Kash Patel released an image showing "anti-ICE" written on a shell casing near the scene.

ROTHROCK: The clearest motivation for this attack are his own words. He says, "I want to cause terror."

VILLAFRANCA: Late yesterday, we saw investigators remove a ladder that the gunman used to get on top of that building and shoot towards the ICE facility, so we asked DHS officials what do they plan to do to secure that building for the agents and detainees. They did not want to get into detail but said plans are being discussed, Tony.
