[ON-SCREEN HEADLINE: Millions Rally at "No Kings" Protests Across U.S.]

ROBIN ROBERTS: We're going to turn now to the No Kings demonstrations around the country. Streets filled with peaceful demonstrators, protesting the Trump administration's policies. Senior political correspondent Rachel Scott is here with the latest for us. Good morning to you.

RACHEL SCOTT: Robin, good morning to you. And this is shaping up to be the largest display of defiance and opposition to President Trump since he took office again. Organizers say nearly seven million people took to the streets with the No Kings protest. The protest what they call an abuse of power by President Trump. The demonstrations happening at more than 2,000 cities and towns. 200,000 people showing up in the President's own backyard in Washington D.C. The protesters saying they were fueled by the President's sweeping cuts in the federal government, crackdown on immigration, and his decision to send the National Guard into Democratic states. The President responded by mocking the rallies on social media, calling it a joke. But these were massive crowds that turned out to send the President a message. This morning, it is being described as one of the largest single-day protests in U.S. history.

ROBERTS: Yeah, it was very peaceful.
