[ON-SCREEN HEADLINE: JFK's Grandson Running for NY Congress]

TONY DOKOUPIL: In other news this morning, we're learning that President John F. Kennedy's only grandson is running for office. Jack Schlossberg, son of Ambassador Caroline Kennedy just announced that he is entering the race for a congressional seat right here in New York City. Ed O'Keefe is following all this for us. Ed, some news here. Good morning.

ED O'KEEFE: That's right, Tony, good morning. The 32-year-old Democrat, the youngest of three children and the only son of Caroline Kennedy and her husband, designer, Edward Schlossberg, he is perhaps best known in political circles for having a quirky, at times crass social media presence that is critical of President Trump and at times, of his cousin, Health and Human Services Secretary Robert F. Kennedy, Jr. Schlossberg says he'll run in the Democratic primary to represent New York's 12th congressional district, as you can see there, encompasses most of Manhattan. Longtime Congressman Jerry Nadler announced in September he is stepping down after next year. Schlossberg campaigned last year on behalf of Kamala Harris and previously for President Biden. In a statement this morning, he says, his campaign "... is for the young at heart, the strong and spirited and anyone who thinks we deserve better." You may think 32 is young to run for Congress, but JFK did it at an even younger age. He won his Boston congressional seat in 1946, Tony, at the ripe old age of 29.

DOKOUPIL: There is always somebody younger, Ed. Jack calls his social media presence trolling for a cause, just underscore that.
