ROBIN ROBERTS: Breaking overnight, anger in Minneapolis, the standoff on Capitol Hill, two actors in custody, and how to hack your grocery bill. Clashes intensifying in Minneapolis between federal agents and residents as the fallout grows over the deadly shooting of Renee Good by an ICE agent as at least six federal prosecutors resign over concerns about the direction of the investigation while President Trump vows "a day of reckoning and retribution" is coming. [ON-SCREEN HEADLINE: Breaking Overnight; Clashes With Federal Agents Escalate in Minneapolis]

MICHAEL STRAHAN: But we're gonna begin a busy news morning with the latest in Minnesota, where clashes between federal agents and residents have been intensifying amid the Trump's administration immigration crackdown. President Trump telling Minnesota "the day of reckoning and retribution is coming." Faith Abubey is on the scene in Minneapolis. Good morning, Faith.

FAITH ABUBEY: Yeah, good morning to you, Michael. The uproar over deadly ICE shooting here in Minneapolis only growing by the day. And now, ABC News has learned that several federal prosecutors have walked off the job amid concerns about a DOJ investigation and the tactics of agents here on the ground. Overnight, flash bangs lighting up the Minneapolis skies as the fight to push ICE out of Minnesota intensifies. Agents seen descending on protesters forcing them back. [SCREAMING] Earlier Tuesday, federal agents seen dragging people out of their cars, and spraying others directly in the face with chemicals. Protesters throwing snow balls and slamming into an ICE vehicle. And newly released video obtained by Bring Me the News showing agents arresting two workers outside a Minnesota Target last week. A state lawmaker says they are both U.S. citizens.

UNIDENTIFIED TARGET EMPLOYEE: I'm a U.S. Citizen.

ABUBEY: This as, according to multiple officials, six federal prosecutors resigned from U.S. Attorney's office in Minnesota over concerns the department is focusing on investigating 37-year-old mother Renee Good for ties to groups or individuals that been protesting or impeding immigration efforts in Minneapolis, including her widow instead of investigating Jonathan Ross,

the ICE agent who shot and killed her last week. The Justice Department calling the killing justified and is not cooperating with state or local agencies on their investigation. President Trump vowing “a day of reckoning and retribution is coming.” The administration announcing Tuesday DHS is revoking temporary protected status for thousands of Somali refugees, saying they must leave this country by March 17. We spoke to several Somali immigrants and refugees shaken over the reversal.

UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE SOMALI: There is no place to go back to there. I don’t think so. It is not safe to go back right now.

ABUBEY: And the Minnesota House of Representatives firing back at the Trump administration saying ending TPS only creates fear, disrupts families, and destabilizes communities. Meantime, activists are trying to leverage economic powers to drive ICE out urging on January 23, no school, no work, no shopping, Robin.

ROBERTS: On January 23. Alright, there, Faith, thank you.
