[ON-SCREEN HEADLINE: MN Prosecutors Resign Over Renee Good Probe]

GAYLE KING: At least six career prosecutors in the Minneapolis office — U.S. Attorney's office have now resigned over the investigation into a federal agent's use of deadly force against Rene Good. The sources say one big reason for their decision is pressure from the Trump administration to investigate Good's widow. Now, this comes as federal agents continue to use very aggressive tactics, people say, on protesters in Minnesota. There are now roughly 2,800 federal agents in the Twin Cities. That is more than double the number of local police. Many people find these type of videos very difficult to watch. Lana Zak has more from Minneapolis on the rising tensions.

LANA ZAK: Just a block from where an ICE agent shot and killed Renee Good last week, demonstrators filled the streets Tuesday as a group of federal law enforcement detained this man. We arrived as it was happening —

PROTESTERS: Shame!

ZAK: — with tensions flaring between residents and masked federal officers. [TO ANTI-ICE PROTESTER] Did you see what happened?

UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE ANTI-ICE PROTESTER: They just stopped him. Traffic.

ZAK [TO ANTI-ICE PROTESTER]: He was just — he was driving by?

UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE ANTI-ICE PROTESTER: Just driving — just driving by, and now we've got — how many agents do we have here with their pepper spray in hand ready to attack us? We're on our streets. They can get off our streets. I paid for this thing.

ZAK: Such incidents occur most every day here, affecting both immigration enforcement targets and protesters.

PATTY O'KEEFE: From my cell, I could hear, like, wailing and desperate crying of people in the facility.

ZAK: Patty O'Keefe says she and a friend were following ICE agents on Sunday when they were stopped, their car pepper sprayed and their windows smashed —

AGENT: You are under arrest for impeding operations.

ZAK: — before being taken to a federal detention center.

O'KEEFE: Three ICE agents that were in the car with me immediately started taunting me. The driver of the car said, “You guys have got to stop obstructing us. That’s why that lesbian is [EXPLOSIVE] dead.”

LANA ZAK: O'Keefe says she was held for eight hours before being released without charges. [TO O'KEEFE] What do you say to people who feel like these agents are doing what they need to do, they're following the law, and you and other protesters are on the wrong side of history?

O'KEEFE: The law is not always the best barometer of what is moral and just.

ZAK: We asked DHS for comment on O'Keefe's detention and accusations, but have not heard back. Today marks one week since Renee Good was killed here. When we asked O'Keefe if she'd continue protesting, she said that she knows that there's risks, but that it is “worth it,” Vlad.
