MICHAEL STRAHAN: Clashes after new shooting in Minneapolis, the urgent return from space, a huge return to the sea, we're live in Florida, and giant news for big blue, let's go. Chaos on the streets overnight. Clashes in Minneapolis, after another shooting by an ICE agent. This morning, what Homeland Security is saying as the mayor calls for calm.

MINNEAPOLIS MAYOR JACOB FREY (D): For anyone that is taking the bait tonight, stop. That is not helpful.

STRAHAN: Plus, new videos raising questions about the tactics of some federal immigration agents.

WOMAN: Can you put the guns down? There's kids in this house.

[ON-SCREEN HEADLINE: Breaking Overnight; Violent Clashes After New Shooting Involving ICE Agent]

ROBIN ROBERTS: But we're going to begin with tensions rising in Minneapolis. Demonstrators clash with police after another shooting by an ICE agent. Homeland Security says the officer shot a man who fled during a traffic stop and then began attacking the officer with two other people. Faith Abubey is on the scene with the latest. Good morning, Faith.

FAITH ABUBEY: Good morning to you, Robin. Angry crowds spilling onto the streets of North Minneapolis last night shortly after the shooting, the situation devolving into chaos, people throwing rocks and fireworks and the mayor begging them to stop taking the bait. Overnight, violent clashes between federal agents and protesters in Minneapolis after a federal agent shot a man during an immigration operation. [SHOUTING]

ANTI-ICE PROTESTER: Get away from him.

ABUBEY: According to the Department of Homeland Security, a federal law enforcement officer shot a Venezuelan man who they say fled traffic stop and then attacked the officer, adding that the officer fired to defend his life, hitting the man in the leg. The department also saying two other people assaulted the officer with a snow shovel and broom. The injured man is in custody.

He and the officer were taken to the hospital. The scene quickly descending into chaos. [SCREAMING] Smoke and flash banks filling the night sky. Agents deploying chemical irritants as demonstrators sent fireworks in their direction. [SCREAMING] ABC affiliate KTSP was on the ground as crowds gathered.

RICHARD REEVE: The smell of those chemical irritants is definitely in the air. You can see a group of ICE agents right now, it looks like they have at least one person in custody.

MINNEAPOLIS POLICE CHIEF BRIAN O'HARA: This is a tense situation, we do not need this to escalate further.

ABUBEY: Officials calling for peace, acknowledging the city is on edge.

FREY: For those that are taking the bait, you are not helping and you are not helping undocumented immigrants in our city.

ABUBEY: It comes one week after the fatal shooting of 37-year-old American citizen and mother Renee Good. The incident sparking protests. Violent scenes playing out on a daily basis. Agents firing pepper spray and dragging people from cars. This newly released video shows the frantic moment as heavily-armed agents used a battering ram to enter an immigrant family's home in Minneapolis.

WOMAN: Can you put the guns down? There's kids in this house. There's kids in the house. Show the warrant first.

ABUBEY: 37-year-old Garrison Gibson, an immigrant from Liberia, was facing removal for a decade-old drug conviction, but his lawyer says he has been checking in with authorities for years.

MARC MROKOSCH: So, if he's this dangerous person, then why are they letting him walk around?

ABUBEY: And, once again, the mayor in Minneapolis saying the situation here with thousands of federal agents on the ground is simply unsustainable. He says his officers are working tirelessly, responding to the chaos instead of focusing on basic 911 calls, George.

STEPHANOPOULOS: We start with tensions rising again in Minneapolis overnight, another shooting by an ICE agent. Wanna go back to Faith Abubey on the scene. Good morning, faith.

ABUBEY: Yeah, good morning to you, George. Angry crowds spilled onto the streets in North Minneapolis last night after the shooting. The situation quickly devolving into chaos. Now, people throwing rocks and fireworks. The mayor here even telling people to stop taking the bait. Some vehicles were ransacked and damaged. People screaming, "ICE, go home, we hate you." Moments before the demonstration, the Department of Homeland Security says a federal officer shot a man in the leg during an immigration operation. They say the Venezuelan man fled a traffic stop and attacked the officer. And then the officer fired to "defend his life," hitting the man in the leg. Now, according to DHS, two other men assaulted the officer with a snow shovel and broom. The injured man is in custody, he and the officer taken to the hospital. Again, a very tense night after second shooting by a federal agent in a matter of a week. The mayor saying the situation with thousands of agents on the ground is simply unsustainable. He says his officers are having to focus and respond to the chaos instead of focusing on basic daily 911 calls. Guys
