MATT RIVERS: We saw pretty chaotic protests yesterday here. Protesters blowing whistles at federal agents, officers, including Commander-at-Large Gregory Bovino, responding back, throwing a smoke canister at the crowd. This as a newly-obtained memo from May shows that ICE agents can enter a suspected person's home without a judicial warrant, instead giving administrative authorization. According to Form I-205, or "warrant of removal/deportation" can be "drafted and signed by an ICE official instead of a judge or magistrate." Experts say it could mean less accountability and more mistakes, but DHS denying that, saying they are following the law to the letter.
