LLAMAS: Okay, we have some breaking news just in, Gabe. Just moments ago, the President posting on Truth social that he may suspend or at least extend the deadline for now. What do we know?

GUTIERREZ: Yeah, that's right, Tom. Just a few moments ago, the President posting on social media that he has been speaking with Pakistani officials who have been acting as mediators here and that subject to Iran agreeing to reopen the Strait of Hormuz that he agrees to suspend the bombing and attack of Iran for a period of two weeks. Now, Tom, Pakistan had floated extending that deadline and had been requesting that Iran opened the Strait of Hormuz for that period as a goodwill gesture, we had just heard from the Iranian backward apack [sic] — ambassador at the Pakistan that said that that was a positive step. But again, things are very fluid at this point. But again, within the past few moments, Tom, President Trump says that it appears to be extending that deadline for two weeks, Tom.

LLAMAS: And Gabe, it looks like there's some more in this Truth Social post. I'm just reading it now. It's just coming to our newsroom. The President just posting this saying that they've also received a 10-point proposed plan from Iran that they believe is in a workable basis on which to negotiate. They're also saying that they've reached and exceeded all their military objectives here. The President going a little further than he did yesterday, even in the Oval Office, or I should say in the White House, he was given that news briefing, Gabe.

GUTIERREZ: Yeah, that's right, Tom. And look, there have been a lot of fast-moving negotiations over the last several hours. And so there were a lot of questions here. Would the President find some sort of off-ramp? It appears, at this point, that he has. But again, in that Truth Social post, we do not have confirmation from the Iranian regime that it has agreed to this. But as you said, the President's saying that he has received a 10-point proposal for Iran. He's calling it a workable — it's a workable basis for future talks. At this point, though, it appears the President backing off that threat —

LLAMAS: Yeah. And — and —

GUTIERREZ: — to annihilate the Iranian government.

LLAMAS: — and ending this post by saying it's a long-term problem that is a close to a resolution. We shall see. Alright, Gabe Gutierrez, with that breaking news.
